His unique background informs his work as a strategist and he has worked as an adviser to the government of Norway, the World Health Organization, the U.N., and the Gates Foundation. Tom also serves as a member of the President's Leadership Council at Search for Common Ground, the world's largest peacebuilding organization, and as a Counsellor to the Melbourne-based boutique political risk firm, Dragoman Global. He was previously Director of Global Projects at the Centre for Humanitarian Dialogue, a Swiss-based international conflict mediation organization and was Associate Director at the Centre on International Cooperation (CIC) at New York University. Before entering the field of international diplomacy, Tom worked as a baker during his college years in Melbourne and Canberra, Australia.

Tom has appeared as a commentator in the media in the U.S., Canada, Australia and the Middle East and has written widely on topics including foreign policy, U.S.-China Relations, and fly fishing in Afghanistan. He holds a Master's degree in International Relations from the Australian National University where he was a Hedley Bull scholar.
